Dear Homeowner:

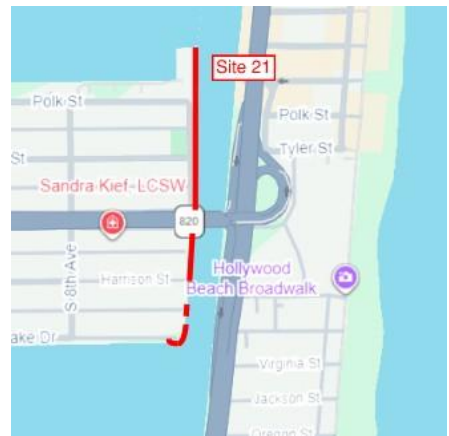
On March 12, 2019, voters in the City of Hollywood approved a General Obligation Bond during a special election to fund various public improvement projects across the city. One of these projects includes the Tidal Flooding Mitigation and Shortline Projection project which aims to comply with Broward County and City ordinances regarding tidal flooding mitigation along City owned shoreline segments adjacent to North Lake, South Lake and the Intercoastal Waterways. It is partly funded through a grant agreement from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection.

We are happy to announce construction of the seawall is nearing completion for 3 of the 4 sites with private boat docks and preparation to start landscaping and restoration have already begun.

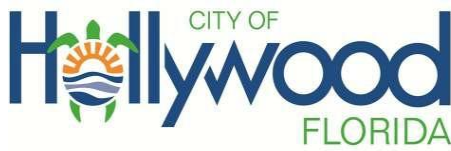
The project will affect the city-owned shoreline across the road from your property. For this purpose, we are providing a general overview of the upcoming activities, what to expect and who to contact should you have any questions.

Asphalt pavement restoration is anticipated to begin in June for Sites 10, 19, and 21 as shown on the maps below for both North and South Lake with an anticipated completion date of June 26, 2026.

The entire project is anticipated to be completed by December 2026.

Key Milestones:

- **June 8 (Sites 10,19, 21) through June 26**
Note: Site 10 East of 8th Ave to be completed at a later date after cul-de-sac seawall completion.

Local traffic impacts are expected to be minimal, and access to your residence will be maintained throughout the entire construction period. Standard construction hours are Monday through Friday, 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM.

If you are leasing a boat dock, a notification was sent on 4/23/2026 advising that dock approach restoration, utility reconnections, and irrigation reconnections may begin.

The City and the contractor continue to work together with all residents to minimize any impacts the project will have. As we continue to move forward with implementation, we have assigned key contact personnel to help clarify and answer any questions you may have specific to your needs. 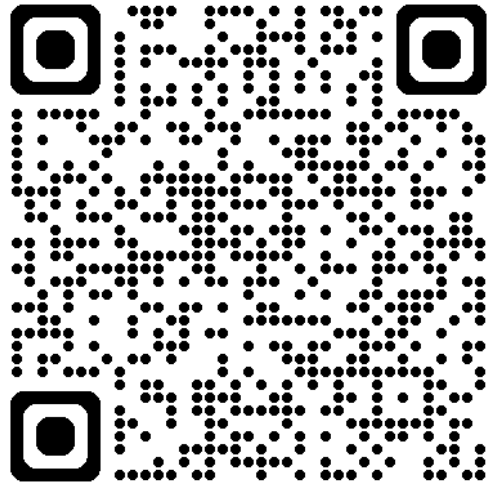
